

Campbell Park Resource Center – Community Impact

Now located on the campus of John Hopkins Middle School, the Campbell Park Resource Center is focused on efforts to lift up the neighborhood, drive change and create positive impact by ensuring that no resident or family is without the resources and services that they need. While much has been accomplished, there's still much to do. We're pleased to share some of the work that's been done and highlight some of the programs that serve the Campbell Park neighborhood.

By the Numbers

- Since July 2018, the Campbell Park Resource Center has increased the number of partners from **four to twenty-five** and it hosts a monthly partnership meeting where **thirty community agencies** come together to connect, collaborate and share resources.
- During the same time period, the Center served **450 households** and **more than 1,000 individuals** – exceeding the goal of 900 – with career services, legal assistance, case management services, housing assistance, financial literacy workshops and much more.
- The Center has also provided workforce development activities for **262 participants** since July 2018 and it launched and continues to host a monthly career fair to connect community residents with prospective employers.

Program Highlights and Resources

- Partnering with Feeding Tampa Bay, the Campbell Park Resource Center hosts “My Mobile Market” – a mobile grocery store providing low-cost dry goods, fruits and produce.
- United Way Suncoast’s Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program is available to provide free tax preparation for residents.
- Financial literacy coaching and career training provide opportunities for residents to take advantage of resources that support financial stability and skills development.
- Free legal services are also available along with services to cover immediate basic needs, including emergency housing assistance and domestic violence guidance. Individuals can also receive help with building support systems for each other to enhance longer term stability.
- A computer lab, open to students and adults, provides opportunities to work on resumes with a coach, tackle school projects and homework, apply for employment and scholarships and take advantage of educational programs.
